Democracy	Understanding how citizens influence decision-making through democratic processes.	<i>A Day in the Life of Marlon Bundo</i> – explores democracy and equality. Enquiry Question: “How can democracy affect equality?”	Year 6
Rule of Law	Understanding that laws protect everyone and are essential for well-being and safety.	<i>This Is Our House</i> – addresses fairness and discrimination. Enquiry Question: “What is discrimination?”	Year 3
Individual Liberty	Encouraging children to make choices and understand rights and personal freedoms.	<i>You Choose</i> – promotes freedom of choice and imagination (Reception). <i>My Shadow is Pink</i> – explores self-acceptance and identity (Year 5). <i>How to Be a Lion</i> – celebrates individuality and courage (Year 2).	Reception, Year 2, Year 5
Mutual Respect	Treating others with respect regardless of differences.	<i>Elmer</i> – celebrates difference and self-acceptance (Year 1). <i>Can I Join Your Club?</i> – promotes inclusion and welcoming others (Year 2). <i>The Boy Who Loved Everyone</i> – explores empathy and kindness (Year 1).	Year 1, Year 2
Tolerance of Different Faiths and Beliefs	Understanding and respecting different cultures, religions, and beliefs.	<i>The Proudest Blue</i> – explores religious identity and pride (Year 6). <i>Mixed</i> – celebrates diversity and unity (Year 4). <i>Is That Your Mama?</i> – explores family diversity and cultural identity (Year 2).	Year 2, Year 4, Year 6
